<b>Easy</b>	Say an adjective beginning with the letter in the space.
<b>Medium</b>	Say an adjective beginning with the letter in the space. Then, make a sentence with the adjective.
<b>Hard</b>	Say an adjective beginning with the letter in the space. Ask a question with the adjective. One group member should answer the question.

## Teacher Notes

Letter Speak is a leveled, communicative board game. It is designed to be used as a supplement or as a time-filler.

Estimated Time: 10-15 minutes

### Rules

#### Easy

Students roll the dice and say an adjective beginning with the letter in the space.

#### Medium

Students roll the dice and say an adjective beginning with the letter in the space. Then, they should make a sentence which contains that adjective.

#### Hard

Students roll the dice and say an adjective beginning with the letter in the space. Then, they should make a question which contains that adjective. They should direct the question at one of the other players and the other player should answer it.

#### Ask the Teacher

The “ask the teacher” pieces should be cut out before the game begins. I find that one “ask the teacher” per player works best. If a student lands on a spot and can’t answer, they can use the “ask the teacher” ticket. Once the player has used the ticket, they must give it to the teacher. The player can’t use it again.

*Note: For each level, it is good for the teacher to model how to play before turning the activity over to the students.*
